



## **Uniform and Jewellery Policy**

### **Introduction:**

- Our school has a uniform to identify its members as part of C' School family. We see the wearing of our uniform as something to be proud of and as a statement of our work and life together as members of the school.

### **Aims and objectives:**

- We expect our children to wear their uniform to school as requested but we do not expect parents/carers to purchase from the School uniform supplier, jumpers or cardigans of the same plain colour can be purchased.
- We aim, as a school, to produce a safe environment where all can learn in safety and because of this, we have a policy over what additional jewellery, footwear, and clothing for PE can be worn.
- This policy aims to produce a consistent school response to the wearing of jewellery and uniform.
- We aim to make all those connected with the school aware of our policy regarding the wearing of jewellery and uniform.

### **Uniform:**

- Our uniform consists of a burgundy sweatshirt, cardigan or jumper with white or light blue T shirt or shirt, black or grey trousers or shorts, black or grey skirt or pinafore dress. In addition, summer dresses in red check or blue check can be worn.
- Children are expected to wear sensible footwear; this can be shoes, trainers, boots or sandals (with toes covered) in any colour, but with a flat heel. No slip-ons or flip-flops are acceptable. If inappropriate footwear is worn to school, children will be asked to wear pumps and staff will talk to parents about what is suitable.

### **PE Kit:**

- Pupils come to school in their PE kit on their PE days.
- PE kit is black or navy shorts and a white T-shirt, or black or navy joggers and a black or navy sweatshirt or hoodie.
- No named items should be worn.

**Jewellery:**

- Jewellery worn at school is not acceptable because of the Health and Safety risk to the child wearing it and to others. The only jewellery allowed is small stud earrings and a small watch. Occasionally, a necklace may have a religious significance and in this case will be allowed at the discretion of the Head of School, through a request in writing.
- Rings, dangling earrings, necklaces and bracelets (including charity bracelets) are not allowed because of the risk to the health and safety of pupils.
- Any unauthorised jewellery worn to school by a child will be confiscated by a member of staff and returned to parents at the end of the day. The school accepts no responsibility for any jewellery lost on the premises.
- Any stud earrings that are worn on a day when PE is carried out, must either be removed by the child or covered with tape. Members of staff cannot remove earrings for Health and Safety reasons.

**The role of parents:**

- We encourage parents to support us in this policy so that precious jewellery is not brought to school and so that the health and safety of children are not compromised.
- This policy has been distributed to all parents at the school.

**Monitoring and review:**

- This policy is monitored on a day-to-day basis by the head of school, who reports to governors about the effectiveness of the policy on request.
- This policy is the governors' responsibility and they review its effectiveness annually. They do this through discussion with the headteacher.
